

## **Albany County**

**City of Albany:** *LWRP Update and Climate Action and Adaption Plan* - The City of Albany will update its 1991 Local Waterfront Revitalization Program and develop a Climate Action and Adaptation Plan. The plan will identify risks, impacts, opportunities and strategies to guide policy on emissions reduction, infrastructure and technologies investments, water and air quality improvement, and development of regulations to minimize risks associated with climate change and sea level rise. \$130,000.00.

## **Bronx County**

**City of New York:** *Connector to the Randall's Island Connector* - The New York City Economic Development Corporation, sponsored by the NYC Department of Small Business Services, will improve the pedestrian and bicycle pathway connections to the Randall's Island Connector, which provides at-grade access from the Port Morris and Mott Haven neighborhoods in the South Bronx to Randall's Island Park. Work will include design and installation of intersection improvements, traffic calming measures, striping, wayfinding signage, landscaping and both on- and off-street pathways and improvements. \$805,000.00.

## **Broome County**

**City of Binghamton:** *Chenango River Trails Connection Project (Construction)* - The City of Binghamton will construct an 0.4 mile extension of the City's Chenango River trail from Cheri Lindsey Park north to the Bevier Street Bridge, establishing a connection with Broome County's Otsiningo trail system. Work will include construction of an asphalt multi-use path and installation of lighting, security systems, trail amenities and landscaping. \$427,000.00.

## **Cayuga County**

**Village of Cayuga:** *Cayuga Village LWRP Visioning and Comprehensive Plan* - The Village of Cayuga on Cayuga Lake will undertake a visioning process in support of the preparation of a joint Comprehensive Plan and Local Waterfront Revitalization Program. The work is intended to reconnect the village with the lake and the Erie Canal through improved access, creation of conservation areas and trails, encourage appropriate new construction and adaptive reuse, and historic preservation. \$60,240.00.

**Town of Springport:** *Springport Visioning Project* - The Town of Springport will undertake a community visioning process that will become the foundation for a town Master Plan. This work is intended to improve waterfront access, protect the water quality of Cayuga Lake, and encourage economic activity through recreation and tourism. \$30,875.00.

## **Chautauqua County**

**City of Jamestown:** *City of Jamestown Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan* - The City of Jamestown will develop a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program to improve water quality in Chautauqua Lake and Chadakoin River and coordinate revitalization efforts. The program will build on other ongoing City initiatives, including the recently-adopted Urban Design Plan, a Brownfields Opportunity Area Pre-Nomination Study, and the Strategic Planning Partnerships Initiative. \$26,000.00.

**City of Jamestown:** *Jamestown Tourism Branding Project* - The City of Jamestown will identify a tourism niche and prepare a tourism development strategy as part of its Jamestown Tourism Branding Project. Branding work will include comprehensive analysis of past/present marketing strategies, trends and opportunities, demographics, and recommendation of concepts and a detailed strategy. The project will also include development of a Marketing Action Plan, a tourism website, brochures, wayfinding signage and displays. \$84,500.00.

**Village of Mayville:** *Village of Mayville - Historic Depot Renovations* - The Village of Mayville will restore its historic railroad depot adjacent to Chautauqua Lake. Work will include roof repair with historically-appropriate materials, installation of cast iron railing, and restoration of the exterior involving acid wash cleaning and brick pointing. \$82,500.00.

**Town of Westfield:** *Streetscape Revitalization Feasibility Study* - The Town of Westfield will conduct a streetscape revitalization feasibility study for 1st Street in the hamlet of Barcelona Harbor on Lake Erie, implementing the recently-completed Westfield-Ripley Waterfront Opportunity Plan. Work will include boundary and topographic survey, outreach to stakeholders, refinement of draft conceptual plans for parks at Main Street and Portage Streets, and analysis of feasibility and costs of proposed improvements. The project will result in recommendation of a streetscape improvement design. \$10,000.00.

**Town of Westfield:** *Barcelona Harbor Pier Improvements* - The Town of Westfield will construct improvements at the Barcelona Harbor pier on Lake Erie in the hamlet of Barcelona Harbor, implementing the recently-completed Westfield-Ripley Waterfront Opportunity Plan. Work will include installation of new lighting, bollards and chains, and two pavilions at the end of the pier, as well as development of a landscape improvement plan for the pier area, adjacent park and visitor center area. \$64,050.00.

### **Clinton County**

**City of Plattsburgh:** *Cumberland Bay Waterfront Rediscovery Program* - The City of Plattsburgh will conduct a feasibility study for development of the state-owned Wilcox dock property and an adjacent privately-owned parcel on Cumberland Bay in Lake Champlain. The study will analyze existing conditions, site constraints, and environmental and archaeological issues, as well as economic feasibility of acquisition, potential restoration and subsequent marketing. \$50,000.00.

### **Columbia County**

**City of Hudson:** *Feasibility Analysis of Multi-Use Waterfront Building* - The City of Hudson will conduct a feasibility analysis for a waterfront multi-use indoor facility. The study will compare the rehabilitation of the city-owned Dunn Building with the construction of a new facility. Architectural details and construction drawings will be developed for the selected alternative. \$55,000.00.

### **Cortland County**

**Cortland County:** *Tioughnioga River Trail* - Cortland County will construct the 2.7-mile, multipurpose Tioughnioga River Trail along the east side of the west bank of the Tioughnioga River. Phase One construction will extend from Albany Street in the Village of Homer to Yaman Park in the City of Cortland. \$750,000.00.

### **Delaware County**

**Town of Middletown:** *Middletown Revitalization Plan* - The Town of Middletown, in collaboration with the Village of Margaretville and hamlet of Arkville, will prepare an Economic Revitalization Plan to capitalize on the scenic and recreation assets of the East Branch of the Delaware River and its tributaries. \$80,000.00.

### **Erie County**

**City of Buffalo:** *Advancing Redevelopment of Buffalo's Waterfront* - The City of Buffalo, in collaboration with the Buffalo Niagara River Keeper and the Valley Community Association, will advance construction of the Buffalo River Historic District Park, a 2.5-acre public access linear park on the Buffalo River; prepare a feasibility study for a community boating facility; and finalize the City's draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program. \$874,360.00.

**Town of Grand Island:** *Bicentennial Park/Scenic Woods - Wetland Delineation and Wetland Boundary Survey* - The Town of Grand Island will conduct wetland delineation and wetland boundary surveys for 229 acres of undeveloped land at Scenic Woods and Bicentennial Park on the Niagara River. This work will advance the Bicentennial Park/Scenic Woods Master Plan prepared for the development of 5.75 miles of educational nature trails throughout the properties. \$10,054.00.

## **Franklin County**

**Village of Tupper Lake:** *Waterfront Revitalization Planning and Implementation* - The Village of Tupper Lake, in partnership with the Town of Tupper Lake, will undertake a waterfront revitalization project for their Raquette River waterfront. The project will include community visioning, updating the joint comprehensive plan and joint zoning ordinance, local capacity building, and construction and installation of improvements to two waterfront parks. Grant funding will also be used to train a newly-hired community development employee. \$195,000.00.

## **Herkimer County**

**Town of Webb:** *Central Adirondack Laboratory for Environmental Studies* - The Town of Webb will plan and design the Central Adirondack Laboratory for Environmental Studies (CALES) in the hamlet of Old Forge on the Moose River at the site of the former Old Forge Arts Center, which is being relocated. Grant funding will support planning and development of architectural design for the laboratory and design for connection to town sewer and water services. The facility will provide housing, laboratory space and offices for scientists and student groups working in the Central Adirondacks. CALES activities will be linked with programming at the Arts Center, providing research and educational opportunities related to the Central Adirondack environment. \$50,000.00.

**Town of Webb:** *Town of Webb Lake Front Revitalization Project* - The Town of Webb in the Central Adirondack region will undertake revitalization of the Old Forge Pond lakefront, improving public access on the Fulton Chain of Lakes. The project will include an engineering feasibility study for the repair and upgrade of the Old Forge navigation docks, and preparation of conceptual designs for the project area to include a lakefront promenade and an open space/park area. \$24,000.00.

## **Jefferson County**

**Town of Clayton:** *Clayton River Walk - Frink Segment, Phase II* - The Town of Clayton will advance Phase II development of the Clayton Riverwalk on the 8.4-acre, Town owned Frink property, encompassing 1,254 feet of St. Lawrence River waterfront. Phase II work will include completion of design for the Frink riverwalk segment, clearing and stabilization of portions of the shoreline, and construction of infrastructure and amenities including two overlooks, three sets of stairs to future docks and one handicapped access ramp, as well as installation of seating, lighting, railing and plantings. \$388,334.00.

**City of Watertown:** *Phase IV Black River Rediscovery Project* - The City of Watertown will design and construct 2,200 feet of pedestrian/bicycle trail around the perimeter of Marble Street Park, and install 850 feet of 6-foot-high chain link fencing at the top of the steep slope to the Black River. A new park sign, street and other signage will be developed and installed. The work will advance a priority project identified in the City's draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program for the Black River waterfront. \$165,000.00.

## **Kings County**

**City of New York:** *New York State Blueway Trail Destination: Restoration of Marine Commandant's House* - The NYC Department of Small Business Services, in partnership with the Brooklyn Navy Yard Development Corporation, will restore Brooklyn Navy Yard Building 92, formerly the Marine Commandant's residence, and design and construct a modern, LEED-certified addition to accommodate additional Navy Yard tenants. The restored Building 92 will become a publically-accessible historical center and a stop along the Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway. \$2,500,000.00.

## **Livingston County**

**Town of Livonia:** *Remediation of Eroded Streambanks in the Conesus Lake Watershed - Phase I* - The Town of Livonia, in cooperation with the Town of Conesus, Village of Livonia, and Livingston County, will implement streambank remediation at four high-priority locations in the Conesus Lake watershed in order to reduce sediment and nutrients entering the lake. Work will include channel and bank reshaping and grading; installation of vegetated gabions, live fascines, rock vanes, boulder toe protection, and buffer area plantings; and replacement and resizing of storm sewers and

culverts. \$382,869.00.

## **Monroe County**

**Village of Fairport:** *Southeast Erie Canal Docking and Promenade Project* - The Village of Fairport will undertake redevelopment of an Erie Canal waterfront site formerly occupied by its Department of Public Works. The project will include design and installation of 750 linear feet of canal breakwall along the south side of the canal, 700 linear feet of pedestrian promenade, 18 lighting fixtures, 55 mooring bollards, 12 docking stations with water, sewer and electrical services, a public pavilion area, gazebo, public art, signage, landscaping, benches, trash receptacles, drinking fountains, and bicycle racks. \$534,150.00.

**Town of Greece:** *Northampton Landing Public Access & Recreation Facilities Study* - The Town of Greece will prepare alternative recommendations for public waterfront access and recreational facilities at Northampton Landing, a 470-acre, undeveloped, town-owned site adjacent to the Erie Canal. Work will include construction cost estimation, identification of potential construction funding sources, and preparation of detailed site plans for two of the identified alternatives. \$25,000.00.

**Town of Penfield:** *Irondequoit Creek Revitalization Project: Ellison Park Bridge and Empire Blvd. Boardwalk* - The Town of Penfield will undertake construction of two projects to enhance access to the Irondequoit Creek waterfront and provide intermunicipal linkages. Work will include installation of a 70-foot pedestrian bridge over the creek in Monroe County's Ellison Park, and construction of two elevated boardwalks traversing Irondequoit Bay wetlands parallel with Empire Boulevard in the LaSalle Landing Development District. Approximately 425 linear feet of boardwalk will be constructed within the Town of Penfield, and 600 linear feet will be constructed within the Town of Irondequoit. \$173,250.00.

**City of Rochester:** *Durand Eastmen Beach Bath House Site Preparation & Improvements* - The City of Rochester will plan, design and construct utilities infrastructure to support the planned bath house at Durand Eastman Beach in Durand Eastman Park on Lake Ontario. This work complements recent investments in water quality improvements at the beach. Design and construction of the bath house and associated amenities will occur during future project phases. \$310,000.00.

**City of Rochester:** *City of Rochester Harbor Management Plan* - To complete and implement its Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, the City of Rochester will prepare a Harbor Management Plan that will advance the City's vision and improve functionality and operation of the Port of Rochester and Genesee River Harbor. Work will include development of harbor management area boundaries and a vision statement, inventory and analysis, and preparation and adoption of the plan. \$150,000.00.

**City of Rochester:** *Erie Harbor Enhancements* - The City of Rochester will design and construct a variety of public amenities to enhance its Genesee River waterfront as part of redevelopment of the former Riverpark Commons site. The project will include design and construction of enhanced public pedestrian access along three public access easement alignments, across a redevelopment site, to link adjacent neighborhoods with the Genesee River/Erie Canal waterfront. The City will also hold a public art competition that will result in the selection, fabrication and installation of artworks along the waterfront to complement the new public access routes. Additionally, streetscape improvements will be designed and installed along the east frontage of Mt. Hope Avenue to complement and connect the City's enhanced waterfront promenade and trail, Genesee Gateway Park, the redevelopment site, and the new public access routes. \$400,000.00.

**City of Rochester:** *Lake Avenue to Lighthouse Trail & Overlook* - The City of Rochester will design and construct a 700-linear-foot multi-use trail, scenic overlook and related pedestrian amenities to connect Lake Avenue with the historic Charlotte-Genesee Lighthouse. The new trail will improve existing street access to the lighthouse, and will ultimately be connected to the trail spur with the nearby Genesee Riverway Trail. In addition to design and construction, the local share will include acquisition of the remaining right-of-way for one-quarter of the proposed trail. \$150,000.00.

**City of Rochester:** *Genesee Valley Park West Master Plan* - The City of Rochester, in partnership with the Genesee Waterways Center, Inc., will conduct master planning for Genesee Valley Park West. The proposed concept includes a

new water sports facility with five boat bays; space for instruction, meetings, offices, and boat storage; rental facilities; indoor exercise areas; and locker rooms. Planning will also include recommendations for vehicle circulation and parking, improving river vistas, relocation and upgrade of existing athletic fields, structural evaluation of the existing center, and hydrogeological study of the shoreline. \$60,000.00.

**Multi: Franklin, Essex County**

**Village of Saranac Lake:** *Saranac Lake Bicycle and Pedestrian Trail Master Plan* - The Village of Saranac Lake will draft a bicycle and pedestrian trail master plan to implement its Local Waterfront Revitalization Program. The master plan will inventory and assess existing bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure; identify potential linkages between existing trails and informal paths; propose new trails and infrastructure; identify a maintenance plan; and prioritize capital improvements. \$40,000.00.

**Multi: Kings, Queens, Richmond County**

**City of New York:** *Design the Edge: Phase 2* - Building on work performed under a previous grant award, the Metropolitan Waterfront Alliance (MWA), sponsored by the New York City Economic Development Corporation, will undertake three "Designing the Edge" projects at Halletts Cove (Queens), Atlantic Basin (Brooklyn), and St. George (Staten Island). Grant funding will support MWA staff and additional consultant services to develop designs and construction drawings for waterfront infrastructure at each of these locations. \$184,738.49.

**Multi: Livingston, Genesee, Monroe, Orleans, Ontario County**

**Village of Palmyra:** *Creating Residential, Commercial and Municipal Upper Floors: A Guidebook for Regional Revitalization* - The Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council (G/FLRPC), sponsored by the Village of Palmyra, will prepare an economic development guidebook for the nine-county G/FLRPC region. The guidebook will explore issues, obstacles and revitalization opportunities, and present design strategies for renovating and filling vacant upper floors in the commercial and mixed-use areas of downtowns. \$54,500.00.

**Multi: Ontario, Yates County**

**City of Canandaigua:** *Implementation and Update of the Canandaigua Lake Watershed Management Plan* - The City of Canandaigua, in partnership with the Canandaigua Lake Watershed Council, will update its adopted watershed management plan to reflect new threats to the lake. In addition, the City will implement identified management actions, including road and stream bank stabilization, drainage design and implementation, improved leaf collection, and regulatory changes to protect the shoreline and access to the lake. Educational programs will also be offered at elementary and middle schools in three school districts in the watershed. \$84,300.00.

**Multi: Ulster, Delaware County**

**Town of Olive:** *Esopus-Delaware Corridor Revitalization Strategy* - The Town of Olive, in partnership with five other municipalities along the Route 28 corridor, will conduct visioning, planning and design for regional revitalization of the Esopus Creek and the East Branch of the Delaware River. The project will include the facilitation of a regional visioning process, student internships focused on the Route 28 corridor that will result in the preparation of findings and background materials, and a semester-long design studio that will result in development of a design guideline handbook for use by local boards. Grant funding will primarily cover contractual services provided by the State University of New York College of Environmental Science and Forestry and the Catskill Center for Conservation and Development. \$91,417.00.

**Multi: Warren, Washington, Essex County**

**Town of Queensbury:** *Lake George Plan for the Future - Management Plan Implementation* - The Lake George Watershed Conference, sponsored by the Town of Queensbury, will undertake an extensive array of projects throughout the watershed intended to advance all priority areas of "Lake George - Plan for the Future". Projects proposed for

funding are: provide technical assistance to monitor development compliance with BMPs; install stream monitoring equipment at eight locations throughout the watershed; administer a property owners' education program for stormwater control; construct stormwater control projects throughout the watershed for which planning is completed; construct in-stream sediment ponds on Fairy Brook and Trout Pavilion; conduct subwatershed assessment for English Brook; refine watershed plan for Dula Pond watershed; conduct GIS-based bathymetric mapping of Lake George; continue Warren County Soil and Water Conservation District hydroseeding activities; update roadway salt and sand use survey; inspect and GPS stormwater catch basins and outfalls throughout the watershed; provide technical assistance through a circuit planner; provide technical assistance through a circuit field compliance specialist; provide GIS database training to municipalities; continue ongoing outreach and education programs; continue ongoing nuisance and invasive species management programs; continue inventorying aquatic resources using hydroacoustic technology; conduct marina inspections for zebra mussels and implement removals; inventory private/commercial/institutional wastewater treatment systems in the watershed; conduct an engineering feasibility study for extending public sewers through the Route 9N corridor; prepare engineering documents and maps for on-site wastewater management district around Pilot Knob Road; implement elements of the Black Point Road sewer extension project; and implement sewer district expansion in the Town of Hague. \$600,000.00.

### **Multi: Wayne, Erie, Monroe, Niagara, Orleans County**

**Wayne County:** *Western Erie Canal Main Street Program* - The Western Erie Canal Main Street Program, sponsored by Wayne County, proposes to continue its general regional coordination duties, and additionally will select one municipality in each of Wayne, Niagara and Orleans Counties to receive technical assistance and training for the revitalization of their downtown. Grant funding will support two years of salary for the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council Program Coordinator, travel costs to meetings and conferences, supplies and materials. \$240,000.00.

### **Nassau County**

**Village of Freeport:** *South Shore Blueway* - The Village of Freeport will undertake planning and infrastructure improvements for a water trail for non-motorized vessels in the western portion of the South Shore Estuary Reserve (SSER), building upon Nassau County efforts to establish regional and SSER water trails. Work will include the identification of launch sites and routes best-suited for non-motorized use; development of signage, a water trail map, a brochure, and a website dedicated to the blueway trail; and the construction of infrastructure improvements to the identified launch sites. \$50,000.00.

**City of Glen Cove:** *Planning for Mill Pond Phase II* - The City of Glen Cove will conduct Phase Two planning and engineering for storm water quality improvements for Mill Pond, including a retention basin, floatable debris control devices and associated landscaping. Grant funds will support the development of conceptual designs, completion of SEQR and permitting, collection and testing of sediment, completion of design and construction documents, bid assistance, preparation of an operation/maintenance plan, and two years of technical assistance and maintenance oversight. Construction is being funded through the 2006 Nassau County Bond Act. \$118,000.00.

**Nassau County:** *Nassau County Catch Basin Insert Program* - Nassau County, in partnership with one or more communities, will purchase and install catch basin inserts as a pilot demonstration project to address stormwater pollution and urban runoff. Work will include a preliminary cleaning of each selected catch basin and subsequent installation of a catch basin insert. Replacement filtration media will also be purchased to facilitate municipal maintenance of the installed inserts. Work will be designed to demonstrate technology effectiveness and determine appropriate maintenance techniques. \$775,000.00.

**Nassau County:** *Comprehensive County Vision for Water-Dependent Maritime Uses* - Nassau County will hire the Regional Plan Association to undertake a county-wide visioning process for the development of a comprehensive plan to manage and protect water-dependent maritime uses and working waterfronts. Grant funding will be used for local salaries, use of County GIS data, mapping supplies and contractual services. \$85,000.00.

**Town of North Hempstead:** *East Sheets Creek Revitalization Project Phase II* - The Town of North Hempstead will continue removal of marine debris on barges resting on the bottom of East Sheets Creek (Manhasset Bay), and determine

requirements for obtaining approvals needed to remove the barges and additional debris embedded in the bay bottom. An estimated 300 tons of marine debris will be removed from an approximately 160 feet long by 400 feet wide area. \$150,000.00.

**Village of Sea Cliff:** *Scudder's Pond Improvements - Phase III* - The Village of Sea Cliff, in partnership with the Hempstead Harbor Protection Committee, will improve water quality and habitat at Scudders Pond by implementing a series of recommendations contained in the Scudders Pond Subwatershed Plan. Work will include completing the removal and disposal of sediment in Scudders Pond, conversion of two small artificial ponds into a vegetative swale, excavating invasive common reed, eliminating direct stormwater discharge and controlling erosion along the southern bank of the pond, replacing the Shore Road weir with a two-stage spillway, and completing an invasive species management plan. \$858,504.00.

## **New York County**

**City of New York:** *Branding Initiative and Ferry Service Feasibility Study for the Harbor District of New York* - The New York City Economic Development Corporation, sponsored by the NYC Department of Small Business Services, will advance planning and promotion for the Harbor District to coincide with the Hudson-Fulton-Champlain Quadricentennial. Branding and marketing work will include a media campaign, printing brochures and maps, hospitality events, development of a website, direct mailing, and the creation of wayfinding signage and banners. The project will also include preparation of a Harbor District Ferry Service Feasibility Study to examine linkages between nine Harbor District sites around New York Harbor and along the Hudson and East Rivers. The feasibility study will consider demand, optimal routes, frequency of service, preferred boat types, best governance, an operational structure, and the location, development, capital and operational costs associated with a Harbor District Ferry Terminal. \$740,057.00.

**City of New York:** *Heliport Park Phase 2* - The New York City Department of Parks and Recreation will construct Phase 2 of the new, 2-acre East 60th Street Heliport Park, located on the East River in Manhattan. Grant funding will support bulkhead and sea rail repair, access ramp improvements, and construction of a rehabilitated sitting area, greenway connection, esplanade and passive park. \$600,000.00.

**City of New York:** *Mannahatta/Manhattan: An Educational Exhibit Based on the Mannahatta Project* - Sponsored by the New York City Department of Parks & Recreation, the Wildlife Conservation Society, in collaboration with the Museum of the City of New York, will develop an educational exhibit and program for the 2009 Quadricentennial celebration that interprets and contrasts the coastal environments of 1609 Mannahatta and Manhattan today. Grant funding will support design, fabrication and installation of an interactive exhibit for the museum, and programming materials and a slide-show for presentation at local schools. \$205,199.00.

**City of New York:** *Freshwater Wetlands Pathway* - The New York City Department of Parks and Recreation, in partnership with the Randall's Island Sports Foundation, will undertake design and construction of the Freshwater Wetlands Pathway segment of the Randall's Island Park bicycle and pedestrian pathway system, which will run under the Hell Gate Bridge railroad trestle alongside the newly-restored 4-acre freshwater wetlands site. Grant funds will support design and construction of the pathway and amenities including benches, lighting, viewing platforms, and an elevated boardwalk that will extend across the wetlands. \$2,207,673.00.

## **Niagara County**

**Village of Lewiston:** *WNY Environmental Plan Enhancements* - To advance an ongoing assessment of environmental programs in the eight western New York Counties, the Village of Lewiston, in partnership with the Community Foundation for Greater Buffalo (CFGB), will consolidate survey and assessment results, develop a website promoting findings, and address identified needs through a capacity-building fund. Grant funding will primarily support CFGB salaries, contractual services provided by the Urban Design Project and the Institute for Conservation Leadership, and the capacity-building grant program. \$69,500.00.

**City of Niagara Falls:** *City of Niagara Falls Parks and Open Space Inventory* - The City of Niagara Falls will complete a Needs Assessment and Master Plan for Niagara Falls parks and open spaces that will include a trail system designed to

connect city parks and open space areas with the Niagara River waterfront. The project will result in a plan to provide residents and visitors with a continuous city wide access trail connecting world class parks and open spaces to the upper Niagara River, existing trails and the Lower Niagara River and Gorge. \$132,500.00.

### **Oneida County**

**City of Rome:** *Mohawk Trail Pedestrian Bridges - Design Development* - The City of Rome will complete preparation of the Design Report for the final 3-mile portion of the proposed 10-mile Mohawk River Trail that will link Erie Canal/Bellamy Harbor Park in the City of Rome to Delta Lake State Park. Trail design will include pedestrian crossing structures and geotechnical analysis. \$60,000.00.

### **Onondaga County**

**Village of Baldwinsville:** *Marble Street Dock Improvements* - The Village of Baldwinsville will construct a sheet pile wall on its Erie Canal/Seneca River waterfront adjacent to Lock 24 to provide small boat dockage in the downtown business district. Grant funding will primarily support construction materials, to be matched by municipal staff services for design and construction. \$70,000.00.

**Town of Cicero:** *Brewerton Revitalization Phase III* - To implement the draft Brewerton Revitalization Plan, the Town of Cicero will construct streetscape improvements along the Route 11 downtown corridor in the hamlet of Brewerton on Oneida Lake. Grant funding will support tree and plant bed preparation, plantings and tree installation, and purchase and installation of tree grates, tree guards, benches, and decorative lighting. \$127,275.00.

### **Ontario County**

**City of Geneva:** *Waterfront Infrastructure Feasibility Study* - The City of Geneva will undertake an engineering feasibility study for infrastructure improvements and construction projects identified in the City's Lakefront/Downtown Development Plan. Work will include the construction of two breakwaters, a pedestrian pier and waterfront promenade, and shoreline stabilization measures along the Seneca Lake shoreline. \$57,000.00.

### **Orange County**

**City of Newburgh:** *Newburgh Waterfront Open Space/Public Access Master Plan* - As part of its ongoing Hudson River waterfront revitalization, the City of Newburgh will prepare a comprehensive waterfront open space plan; develop design guidelines and maintenance and operation strategies to be used along the riverfront and adjacent access areas; develop conceptual designs for streetscapes and open spaces in the Vaux Park and Broadway Mall Linkage between the Liberty Street Heritage Corridor and Water Street; and construct an expansion to Newbury Landing Park and the new South Street Waterfront Park. \$348,600.00.

### **Orleans County**

**Village of Medina:** *Medina Community Vision Plan* - The Village of Medina will prepare a Community Vision Plan to identify and prioritize revitalization opportunities for its Erie Canal waterfront, downtown area, and the community. Work will include community consensus-building; inventory and analysis of issues, opportunities and constraints; preparation of recommendations and a final report. \$30,000.00.

**Orleans County:** *Expansion and Update of the Regional Dredging Plan for Lake Ontario* - Orleans County, in partnership with the Counties of Niagara, Oswego, Monroe, and Wayne, and the Town of Greece and City of Oswego, will update and expand the Lake Ontario Regional Dredging Plan to include Orleans and Niagara Counties. Project components include review of existing data, analysis of channels in Orleans and Niagara Counties, public outreach, and an analysis of economic impact, dredging technologies and funding mechanisms. \$35,000.00.

## **Rensselaer County**

**City of Troy:** *Rensselaer Iron Works Artifact Park & Esplanade* - The City of Troy will continue implementation of public access priorities from the Rensselaer Iron Works Master Plan and South Troy Working Waterfront Revitalization Plan, including construction of a 500-foot Hudson River promenade and a pocket park at the former Iron Works site. Grant funds will be used to construct the promenade and install benches, lighting, and railings. \$305,000.00.

## **Richmond County**

**City of New York:** *Forest Restoration at Conference House Park Phase II* - The New York City Department of Parks and Recreation will expand restoration and public awareness activities for the significant natural areas of Conference House Park in southern Staten Island. Grant funding will support removal of non-native plants; restoration of the degraded hackberry forest by replanting with native species; and volunteer recruitment and educational events. \$130,000.00.

## **Rockland County**

**Village of Haverstraw:** *Henry Hudson Quadricentennial Park* - The Village of Haverstraw will design and construct Henry Hudson Quadricentennial Park, a component of the public improvements that are part of Ginsburg Development Companies' (GDC) Haverstraw Waterfront Development Project. The project will include design and engineering, soil survey, permitting, shoreline stabilization, walkway construction, landscaping, and installation of amenities. The donation of fee simple title to the 1.53-acre Site C Promenade Parcel by GDC to the Village is proposed as local match for grant funding. \$1,000,000.00.

## **Saratoga County**

**Town of Halfmoon:** *Hudson River Waterfront Park* - Building on EPF-funded design work, the Town of Halfmoon will construct a new park on a 2.5-acre, town-owned parcel with 270 linear feet of Hudson River waterfront. The park will include an ADA-accessible car-top boat launch and small watercraft docking facilities, associated parking area, pavilion for gatherings, picnic tables, grills, and restrooms. Work will include removal of existing structures on the site, installation of infrastructure and services, and park construction. \$187,500.00.

## **Schenectady County**

**Village of Scotia:** *Scotia Waterfront Recreation Area Improvement Project* - The Village of Scotia will implement the draft Schenectady County Local Waterfront Revitalization Program by completing site investigation, and designing and constructing erosion control measures along 2,000 linear feet of Mohawk River shoreline at Schonowee Avenue, Freedom Park, and adjacent properties. The project will include a combination of hard and soft armoring measures, as well as landscaping and construction of a walking path, overlook, and dock improvements. \$750,000.00.

## **Seneca County**

**Town of Romulus:** *Seneca County Uniform Dockings and Moorings Law* - The Town of Romulus, in partnership with the Towns of Fayette, Varick, Ovid, and Seneca Falls, will, through the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council and Seneca County Community Development and Planning, develop a uniform local law regulating docking and mooring standards for Seneca and Cayuga Lakes, and produce a guidebook on roles and responsibilities of government entities with oversight over lake issues. The project will include data collection and real property surveys, physical inventory of in-water structures, and subsequent preparation of the guidebook and law. \$30,000.00.

## **St. Lawrence County**

**Town of Canton:** *Pedestrian Pathway - Willow Island and Heritage Waterfront Parks* - The Town of Canton will prepare a feasibility analysis for a portion of a pedestrian/bicycle access pathway under the Rt. 11 Bridge over the Grasse River that links Willow and Coakley Islands. Based upon the feasibility analysis, the Town will subsequently prepare

preliminary engineering designs for the pathway. \$22,000.00.

## **Suffolk County**

**Town of Babylon:** *Digitization of Town of Babylon Drainage Infrastructure* - The Town of Babylon will digitize stormwater infrastructure maps for use in the development of watershed action plans and stormwater management plans for waterways and tributaries emptying into the Great South Bay. Work will include georeferencing existing imagery, and the creation of a geodatabase for infrastructure and natural features. \$30,000.00.

**Town of Brookhaven:** *Forge River - TMDL* - The Town of Brookhaven will complete the Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) analysis for the Forge River, a state-identified Impaired Water Body requiring a TMDL. The project will develop a water quality model to determine the most effective and feasible means of restoring the river to ecological health, an implementation plan and a monitoring plan. \$100,000.00.

**Town of Islip:** *Tariff Street Stormwater Mitigation* - The Town of Islip will conduct stormwater mitigation in the South Shore Estuary Reserve along Tariff Street in the hamlet of Sayville, implementing a top priority of the Green's Creek and Brown's River Watershed Management Plan. Work will include design and construction of 28 leaching pools along Tariff Street, installation of sediment traps and piping, and replacement of pavement and curbing. \$90,000.00.

**Town of Shelter Island:** *Shelter Island LWRP Visioning Project* - The Town of Shelter Island, in partnership with the Village of Dering Harbor, will undertake a visioning and planning process to develop local and regional revitalization strategies and a long-term plan for the protection of the island's Peconic Estuary waters and waterfront resources. The Town will conduct a series of public workshops to identify local, intermunicipal and regional assets and issues; generate community consensus and a vision for the future; prepare implementation strategies; and develop organizational capacity to implement the strategies. \$23,500.00.

**Town of Southampton:** *Preparation of Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan for Southampton Town* - The Town of Southampton will prepare a Local Waterfront Revitalization Program (LWRP), a Harbor Management Plan and an Intermunicipal Waterbody Management Plan. Municipal staff will prepare the Harbor Management Plan and Intermunicipal Waterbody Management Plan, and consultant services will be used to develop and integrate the other elements into a full LWRP. \$100,000.00.

**Town of Southold:** *Developing Priority Impaired Waterbody and SGA Subwatershed Management Plans* - To advance implementation of the Peconic Estuary Program's 2006 Subwatershed Management Plans, the Town of Southold will develop watershed management plans for the Town/Jockey, Goose, and Richmond Creek complexes that address water quality impairments, closed shellfishing waters and point and non-point pollution. Work will include watershed assessment, identification and cost benefit analysis of alternative management strategies, and preparation of recommendations. \$55,000.00.

## **Sullivan County**

**Sullivan County:** *Upper Delaware River Local Waterfront Revitalization Program - Making the Connections* - Sullivan County and its Division of Planning and Environmental Management will prepare an intermunicipal Local Waterfront Revitalization Program for villages and towns along the Upper Delaware River Corridor in Delaware, Sullivan and Orange Counties. Grant funding will cover salaries and materials for visioning and other workshops. \$82,050.00.

## **Ulster County**

**Town of Esopus:** *Aquatic Weed Harvester Program* - To implement its Local Waterfront Revitalization Program, the Town of Esopus will acquire a replacement mechanical aquatic weed harvester to improve efficiency of the Town's aquatic vegetation control program, thereby preserving access to public beaches, use of non-motorized boating facilities and fishing areas of the river. \$59,087.50.

**Town of Lloyd:** *Waterfront Restoration of Bob Shepard Highland Landing Park* - The Town of Lloyd will continue

development of the Bob Shepard Highland Landing Park on a recently-purchased property on the west bank of the Hudson River. Work will include construction of 750 linear feet of bulkhead, a boat launch and a deepwater dock. \$911,904.00.

**Ulster County:** *Ulster County Regional Waterfront Revitalization Plan* - Ulster County will conduct visioning for a regional waterfront revitalization plan for the County's Hudson River waterfront municipalities. The County will create a project website for stakeholder outreach, develop a GIS database, and purchase 3D "visualization" software. Consultant services will be utilized to facilitate visioning workshops with municipal representatives and constituent stakeholders, and draft recommendations on computer-simulated scenarios, potential modifications to existing plans and statutes, and smart growth development opportunities. \$100,000.00.

## **Warren County**

**Town of Bolton:** *Town of Bolton LWRP Update* - Building on the recent adoption and implementation of its Comprehensive Plan, the Town of Bolton will update and finalize its draft Local Waterfront Revitalization Program. This update is intended to respond to regional growth pressures and will balance the desire for development with maintaining a high quality of life, a vibrant hamlet with rural homesteads, and Lake George as a primary natural resource. \$23,800.00.

**Town of Bolton:** *Construction of Bolton Town Pier Improvements* - The Town of Bolton will construct improvements to the town pier on Lake George. Work will include the reconstruction of the east side of the pier and installation of composite decking, a new public dock shelter, silt traps to manage stormwater, two dry hydrants, safety railings, and additional ADA-compliant dock slips. \$250,000.00.

**Town of Hague:** *Town Gateway Improvements* - To implement the recommendations of the Downtown Enhancement Plan, the Town of Hague will design and construct improvements to three gateways to its downtown on Lake George, including the northern and southern entrances via Route 9N and at the westerly entrance on Route 8. Work will include the design and construction of the gateways, development and installation of wayfinding signage, and installation of lighting and improvements to the parking area for the Falls Overlook Trail on Route 8. \$60,800.00.

**Town of Lake Luzerne:** *Downtown Revitalization and Riverside Trail Project* - Building on its draft Comprehensive Plan and Waterfront Revitalization Strategy, the Town of Lake Luzerne will prepare a Hamlet Revitalization Plan that will focus on economic development strategies, physical improvements and maintenance, and historic preservation. \$20,000.00.

**Warren County:** *First Wilderness - Building the Future* - Warren County will advance several elements of the First Wilderness Heritage Corridor Plan. Work will include planning, design and construction of improvements to the North Creek Train Station complex; planning and analysis for an update of the North Creek Action Plan; an economic and marketing analysis for extension of the First Wilderness Corridor to Tahawus; and updates and upgrades of the Heritage Corridor website. \$258,270.00.

## **Washington County**

**Town of Fort Ann:** *Champlain Canal Waterfront Park* - The Town of Fort Ann, in partnership with the Village of Fort Ann, will design and construct the Champlain Canal Waterfront Park to provide passive recreational amenities and public dockage for day and overnight transient boaters. Project components include preliminary and final design work, permitting, site survey, shoreline stabilization, pathway construction, and installation of stormwater management structures, a kiosk, landscaping, benches, picnic tables, ornamental lighting, a canoe and kayak launch, a public boat dock, electric and water service, and signage. \$225,000.00.

**Village of Granville:** *Mettowee Riverfront Revitalization Strategy* - The Village of Granville will conduct planning to develop a Mettowee Riverfront Revitalization Plan to develop recreational access to the river and create a cultural village campus that will connect downtown and riverfront resources and encourage revitalization of deteriorated commercial and residential properties. \$24,000.00.

**Town of Arcadia:** *Wayne County Canalfront Revitalization Program* - The Town of Arcadia, in partnership with the Genesee/Finger Lakes Regional Planning Council (GFLRPC) and other participating Wayne County canalfront municipalities, will conduct community visioning in anticipation of preparing a regional waterfront revitalization program for the Wayne County canalfront. Grant funding will support two years of GFLRPC Program Coordinator salary, travel costs for meetings, supplies and materials. \$35,000.00.

## **Wayne County**

**Town of Huron:** *Town of Huron Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan* - Building on recent planning and statute development, the Town of Huron, with waterfront on Lake Ontario, Sodus Bay, East Bay and Port Bay, will undertake preparation of a Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan. The plan will address public waterfront access, recreational use, and revitalization of the waterfront to catalyze economic development. \$40,000.00.

## **Westchester County**

**Town of Cortlandt:** *Town of Cortlandt LWRP - Visioning & Development of Revitalization Strategies* - The Town of Cortlandt will conduct visioning to develop a Local Waterfront Revitalization Plan. Work will include public outreach, inventory and analysis, mapping, meeting facilitation and identification of objectives and implementation techniques. Grant funding will also support update of the 2003 Verplanck Waterfront Master Plan that guides development of Steamboat Riverfront Park on the Hudson River in the hamlet of Verplanck, a significant component of the Town's waterfront revitalization efforts. \$34,250.00.

**Village of Hastings-on-Hudson:** *Quarry Legacy Park Design* - The Village of Hastings-on-Hudson will prepare a preliminary design to develop Old Quarry Park, a 5.5-acre passive recreation park. Associated signage will also be designed as part of this project. The proposed park site, located east of the Old Croton Aqueduct, once a marble quarry, was a landfill until 2000 and requires testing, closure and remediation. \$85,000.00.

**City of New Rochelle:** *Echo Bay Shoreline Restoration* - The City of New Rochelle will conduct design and planning for shoreline restoration along one-half mile of Echo Bay, a sheltered inlet off Long Island Sound adjacent to the city's downtown. The restored shoreline will feature a shoreline trail, esplanade, restored wetlands and active recreation areas. Work will include environmental characterizations and site survey, and the preparation of shoreline restoration schematic designs and design and construction documents. \$385,000.00.

**Village of Tarrytown:** *Tarrytown's Hudson River Waterfront Parks - Andre Brook Restoration* - The Village of Tarrytown will restore the Andre Brook tributary to the Hudson River as part of Tarrytown's Hudson River Waterfront Parks Redevelopment Project. The project will include design, site preparation and construction, and will involve the installation of erosion control measures, boulders and silt inhibitors, channel dredging and relocation, and subsequent plantings. \$742,827.00.

## **Yates County**

**Village of Penn Yan:** *Waterfront Park and Trail Improvements* - The Village of Penn Yan will implement the draft Waterfront Revitalization Strategy for its Keuka Lake waterfront by advancing four identified component projects. Work will include construction of a concrete path and sidewalks connecting the Keuka Lake Outlet Trail to the downtown business district; upgrading 5,000 linear feet of the trail to eliminate safety hazards; replacement of the Red Jacket Park bathhouse; and installation of wayfinding signage for the waterfront and downtown business district. \$150,000.00.
