CAPITAL REGION REGIONAL ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT COUNCIL

City of Albany: *Albany Waterfront Performance Place and Livingston Landing*

County(ies): Albany

CFA #18790

The City of Albany will design a state-of-the-art covered stage, improvements to the existing 800-seat amphitheater, and docks at Albany's Corning Preserve. This project will advance the City's desire to become a premier destination for waterfront events and performances, as well as a local and regional destination for recreation and waterfront access.

Total Project Cost: \$400,000

Amount Awarded: \$200,000

Town of Chester: *Implementation of the Schroon Lake Watershed Management Plan*

County(ies): Essex, Warren

CFA #15154

The Town of Chester, in cooperation with the Schroon Lake watershed communities and Warren County Soil and Water Conservation District, will implement recommendations from the Schroon Lake Watershed Management Plan. Project components include: construction of stormwater retrofit projects; a roadside erosion control program; a voluntary on-site wastewater treatment system pumpout and water conservation program; implementation of invasive plant management strategies to control Eurasian milfoil; and Lake Stewardship programs.

Greene County: *Design and Construct Historic Catskill Downtown and Waterfront Enhancements*

County(ies): Greene

CFA #16707

The Village of Catskill will design and construct the Catskill Creek Walking Loop, which will serve as a connection between historic Main Street and the commercial and recreational area on the south side of the creek. The project will provide a uniform walking surface, lighting, railings, and landscaping.

Town of Prattsville: *Enhance Route 23 Streetscape*

County(ies): Greene

CFA #16422

The Town of Prattsville will undertake a multi-component project to enhance and revitalize the Route 23 (Main Street) streetscape, which was devastated by the flooding from Hurricane Irene in August 2011. The project advances priority projects identified in the Town's Long Term Recovery Strategy, and includes design of streetscape infrastructure, pedestrian facilities, and stormwater improvements.

City of Troy: *Riverfront Park Access Improvements and Connections*

County(ies): Rensselaer

CFA #17314

The City of Troy will build on recent improvements to the Riverfront Park area by creating linkages to the nearby Restaurant District and creating an additional access point to the park from downtown. The project will further implement the Riverfront Park Master Plan and enhance pedestrian circulation and connections.

Town of Stillwater: *Preparation of Town of Stillwater Local Waterfront Revitalization Program*

The Town of Stillwater will develop a revitalization strategy for its Hudson River waterfront area to advance hamlet revitalization and public access to the river. The strategy will include economic development and land use techniques based on smart growth principles, and will be used to identify specific opportunities for enhanced access along the Hudson River waterfront and historic Champlain Canal.

Total Project Cost: \$75,000 Amount Awarded: \$37,500

City of Glens Falls: *Implementing the Pruyn's Island Redevelopment and Connection Plan*

County(ies): Warren CFA #16698

To implement the draft Pruyn's Island Master Plan, the City of Glens Falls will prepare preliminary designs for a waterfront promenade; identify improvements to manage stormwater runoff; evaluate redevelopment opportunities and enhancements for the Feeder Canal; identify funding opportunities for the relocation and redevelopment of the Finch Paper wood yard facility; prepare new zoning design guidelines; and design and construct gateway enhancements along Murray Street.

Total Project Cost: \$154,500 Amount Awarded: \$77,250

Town of Lake George: *Preparation of a Community Revitalization Strategy for the Town of Lake George*

County(ies): Warren CFA #16869

The Town of Lake George will prepare a Community and Waterfront Revitalization Strategy to address land use, economic development, water quality, preservation, and sustainability issues. The project will ensure the Town of Lake George updates its land use program to protect water quality and aesthetics to ensure high quality of life for residents, a sustainable community to operate business, and an attractive destination for tourists and visitors.

Village of Lake George: *Improvements at Charles R. Wood (Lake George Environmental) Park*

County(ies): Warren CFA #15558

The Village of Lake George, with project partners, will construct elements of the Charles R. Wood Park (Lake George Environmental Park) including: a children's adventure play area; skateboard park; interpretive elements; primary park entrance; signage; and sidewalks connecting to the Beach Road and the Warren County Bike Path.

Village of Lake George: *Reconstruction of Public Docks*

County(ies): Warren CFA #18645

The Village of Lake George will reconstruct public docks along Beach Road destroyed during Hurricane Irene in September 2011. The construction will include a permanent pile dock system, which is a more robust structure requiring much less maintenance.

Warren County: *Implementation of the First Wilderness Heritage Corridor Action Plan*

County(ies): Warren CFA #15433

Warren County, in partnership with the communities along the Upper Hudson River and Delaware & Hudson rail line in Saratoga and Warren counties, will advance recommendations of the First Wilderness Heritage Corridor Action Plan. Project components include: design of a new train station in the Village of Corinth; restoration of the historic bandstand in the Town of Warrensburg; and design of a new waterfront park on a 3.5 acre former brownfield site in the Town of Warrensburg.

Total Project Cost: \$616,000 Amount Awarded: \$308,000

Village of Lake George: *Lake George Water Quality Assessment and Management*

County(ies): Warren, Washington, Essex CFA #19004

The Village of Lake George, with project partners, will conduct Stream Corridor Water Quality Monitoring for water quality and morphology; incorporate improved knowledge of stream morphology; assess effectiveness of existing stormwater management and control including the West Brook Stormwater Control project; restore stream corridors; and provide outreach and education to improve operation of on-site wastewater treatment systems.

Village of Fort Edward: *Canal Street Farmers Marketplace Project*

County(ies): Washington CFA #18580

The Village of Fort Edward will redevelop an historic Canal building for use as a permanent location of a regional farmers market. The Old Champlain Canal Barn, which was built in the 1880's and has been used by the Department of Public Works for storage over the last 50 years, will be redeveloped as Canal Street Farmers Marketplace, which will include retail space for agricultural goods produced in Washington, Warren and Saratoga counties.

Cayuga County: *Owasco Lake Watershed Management and Waterfront Revitalization Plan*

County(ies): Cayuga, Tompkins, Onondaga CFA #19472

Cayuga County will prepare an updated and expanded watershed management plan for Owasco Lake that will consider not only watershed management, but also appropriate recreational uses along the shoreline of Owasco Lake and the Owasco Inlet, and other tributaries. Maintaining water quality in Owasco Lake is critically important for public water supply and because the lake serves as a source of beauty and recreation for residents and visitors.

Onondaga County: *Onondaga Loop the Lake Trail*

County(ies): Onondaga CFA #18474

Onondaga County will produce a feasibility study and conceptual designs to complete the Loop the Lake Trail on Onondaga Lake and Onondaga Creek. The study will consider connectivity between the Loop the Lake Trail and the City of Syracuse's Onondaga Creekwalk, as well as a variety of other area trails to provide connectivity between the trail, the lake, and the surrounding community.

City of Syracuse: *Bridge Removal at Onondaga Creek*

County(ies): Onondaga

CFA #15301

The City of Syracuse will remove three, low abandoned railroad bridges that cross over Onondaga Creek, adjacent to the Armory Square commercial district. These bridges presently serve as barriers that contribute to flooding during severe rain events. Removal of the bridges will greatly improve the hydrology and significantly restore the creek channel's ability to contain a 100-year flood event.

City of Geneva: *Access Improvements to Seneca Lake*

County(ies): Ontario

The City of Geneva will design and construct shoreline improvements along the Seneca Lake waterfront, a multi-use path from Castle Creek to Lakefront Beach, boat launch jetty improvements, and a raised planter roundabout. The project implements the City's Waterfront Infrastructure Feasibility Study.

City of Canandaigua: *Promotion and Protection of Canandaigua Lake*

The City of Canandaigua and Canandaigua Lake Watershed Council will promote tourism/recreation and protect the Lake as a drinking water supply, create wetlands, manage stormwater in Sucker Brook subwatershed; stabilize eroding road banks and streams in South Bristol, Naples, Italy and Gorham; value and identify ways to protect the high rate of return Natural Capital provides to the economy; enhance watershed educational programs; and support a Watershed Program Manager position.

Town of Wayne: *Preparation of a Strategy for a Sustainable Keuka Lake*

County(ies): Steuben, Yates

The Town of Wayne, watershed municipalities, and a consortium of agencies and organizations, will advance the Keuka Lake Watershed Land Use Planning Guide by developing resources for municipalities, including model laws; land use training and public outreach; creation of a water quality internship program; watershed zoning, infrastructure and watershed mapping; an agricultural assessment; and an update the Planning Guide for the Keuka Lake Land Use Leadership Alliance.

Town of Jerusalem: *Town of Jerusalem Waterfront Revitalization Strategy*

County(ies): Yates

CFA #18725

The Town of Jerusalem will prepare a waterfront revitalization strategy for its Keuka Lake and Sugar Creek waterfronts. The plan will include community-based vision and goals for revitalization and protection of waterfront resources, analyze current conditions of the natural and cultural resources, identify land and water uses and future waterfront projects, and determine local regulations needed to support implementation. The plan will complement the development of the Finger Lakes Museum.

The Village of Penn Yan will construct utility improvements including water, sanitary sewer and storm water system upgrades, and a natural trail around the development connecting to existing trail structure to facilitate the future development of the former Penn Yan Marine property centered on a 14.7 acre Brownfield site located within the Village of Penn Yan, Town of Milo, and County of Yates.

The Village of Greenport will evaluate and report on the current and expected economic impact resulting from upgrading its tourist facilities and stimulating overall tourism in the Village. The project will include the analysis of the effect of the Greenport Tall Ships Festival and other similar potential events that could be undertaken to help businesses and residents preserve the Village's maritime culture and improve its overall economic well being.

Village of Greenport: *Mitchell Park Bulkhead Feasibility Study*

This study will be used to support the development of plans and specifications for bidding, projected costs, required permits, and a consideration of potential funding and financing options for construction.

Village of Port Jefferson: *Port Jefferson Pedestrian Trail Enhancements and Waterfront Parking Reconfiguration*

The Village of Port Jefferson will improve two pedestrian walkways connecting Port Jefferson's downtown commercial district on West Broadway, the upper historic district on East Main Street and West Broadway across from the nearby Harbor complex, and restore the Baker Alley easement on East Main Street.

Village of Sag Harbor: *Construction of Havens Beach Storm Water Improvements*

The Village of Sag Harbor will retrofit storm water drainage infrastructure that currently delivers untreated storm water runoff directly offshore of Havens Beach – a Village beach open to the general public – through a drainage ditch that bisects the beach, resulting in frequent beach closures after heavy rain.

Town of Southold: *Southold Watershed and Sewershed Mapping*

The Town of Southold will implement the final phase of a multi-component storm water infrastructure identification and mapping project that will include the mapping and modeling of all watersheds and subwatersheds within the Town. Sewersheds would also be mapped to determine contributions and conveyances to the MS4 system in an effort to enable the Town to develop watershed management plans for each watershed in the future.

The park will be located at the site of a former lumberyard and would be highly visible from the Walkway Over the Hudson pedestrian bridge.

City of Poughkeepsie: *Preparation of Poughkeepsie Waterfront Redevelopment Strategy*

The City of Poughkeepsie will complete a coordinated waterfront development strategy with a focus on the Mid-Hudson Bridge, the Walkway Over the Hudson, and the area around the Poughkeepsie Railroad Station. The project will advance the development of Requests for Proposals for new mixed-use development near the Poughkeepsie Railroad Station, construction and improvement of paths and streetscapes, enhancements to both City and private parks along the Hudson River, and updates to the City's Local Water Revitalization Program.

This kayak park will serve as a premier destination that would capture kayakers who currently drive through Port Jervis to reach other attractions up the Delaware River.

Town of Tusten: *Construction of Narrowsburg Big Eddy Esplanade*

County(ies): Sullivan

The Town of Tusten will construct the Big Eddy Esplanade along the Delaware River in the Hamlet of Narrowsburg. The project will restore and stabilize the riverbank and construct an esplanade pathway overlooking the river, connecting two access points from Main Street, and a pathway from Main Street to the river's edge.

City of Kingston: *Design and Construction of the Hudson Landing Promenade*

Otsego County will establish a Regional Main Street Coordinating Program to help revitalize communities located along the Erie Canalway National Heritage Corridor, Mohawk Valley Heritage Corridor, Erie Canalway, the Mohawk River, Otsego Lake and the Susquehanna River, with a focus on traditional commercial downtowns.

The New York City Department of City Planning will complete an Open Industrial Uses Study to address issues related to flooding and dispersion of on-site contaminants. The project will examine pollution prevention controls and existing standards and regulations for materials storage. An outreach program to inform industry stakeholders of any amendments to facility siting and pollution prevention controls, and incentives offered to bring facilities into compliance will be developed.

City of New York: *Randalls Island Connector*

County(ies): Bronx, New York CFA #16070
The New York City Department of Small Business Services, in partnership with the New York City Economic Development Corporation, will complete Phase II construction of the Randall's Island Connector and install landscaping and green stormwater management infrastructure. The Connector will provide a critical transportation link and at-grade pedestrian and bicyclist pathway over the Bronx Kill, the waterway that connects the Harlem River to the East River.

City of New York: *Sunset Park Upland Connector*

The New York City Department of Transportation will partner with UPROSE to develop the Sunset Park Upland Connector, connecting the Sunset Park to the waterfront. The project will improve the streetscape and establish pedestrian and bicycle connectivity to the Bush Terminal Piers Park and the Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway. Work will include community engagement, planning and design, sidewalk enhancements, green stormwater infrastructure, landscaping, and pedestrian amenities.

City of New York: *Sunset Park - Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway Connector*

The New York City Department of Transportation will complete construction of the Sunset Park segment of the Brooklyn Waterfront Greenway. This segment of the greenway extends from the Hamilton Avenue Bridge at the Gowanus Canal to 43rd Street and 1st Avenue in Sunset Park. Work will include final engineering and design and construction of protected bicycle facilities, broadened landscaped sidewalks, green stormwater infrastructure and signage.
